Eligibility

To participate in AACES, you must:

- Have a diagnosis of Autism Spectrum
 Disorder (Asperger's Syndrome, PDD-NOS or High Functioning Autism)
- Be able to attend programs independently and navigate adjoining mall without support
- Have an IQ score of 70 or above
- Demonstrate motivation to participate and agree to adhere to program expectations which will be explained upon admission

AGE CRITERIA

- 16+ for job preparation workshops, work place social skills seminars, community classes and Junior Coffeehouse
- 18+ for the service learning center, job coaching, vocational assessments, employment consulting and Coffeehouse

EDUCATION CRITERIA

 High school diploma or GED for job coaching, vocational assessments, employment consulting and Coffeehouse

RESIDENCY CRITERIA

- Bucks County residency for service learning center, Coffeehouse and Junior Coffeehouse
- Bucks or Montgomery County residency for job coaching and vocational assessments
- Job preparation workshops, workplace social skill seminars, employment consulting and community classes do not have residency restrictions
