
Going out to eat at a restaurant can be fun! I can spend time with my family and enjoy the food.




Every restaurant is different. Sometimes they can be loud, quiet, crowded, or have fewer people. Some can have bright lights, or they can be darker.

After the bill is paid, I can leave the restaurant.











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
