

URINALYSIS

When I am on probation or parole, I may not be allowed to use illegal drugs or drink alcohol.



Random drug testing for illegal drugs or alcohol may be needed if I am on probation/parole.



If I am on probation or parole, I may have to provide a urine (pee) sample.



A urine sample is pee in a plastic cup that will be tested.



A urine sample is needed to make sure I am not using any illegal drugs or drinking alcohol.



To make sure I give a urine sample that can be trusted, a probation or parole officer may have to watch me as I pee in the cup.



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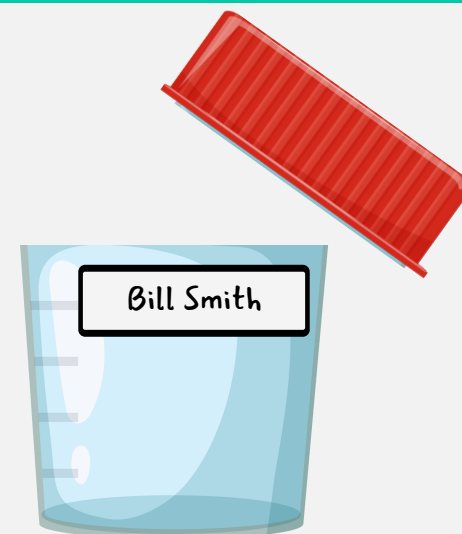
I may feel uncomfortable with this. It is ok to tell my probation/parole officer how I feel, but I will still need to follow the rules and pee in the cup for the urine sample.



I will be given an empty plastic cup. My probation or parole officer will write my name on it or ask me to write my name on it.



I will take off the lid of the cup.



I will urinate (pee) in the cup. I don't have to fill the cup up. If I can't pee, I can drink water and try again later.



I will then put the lid on the cup.



If I get pee on the cup, I can wipe it with a paper towel or toilet paper and wash my hands when I'm done.



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I will give the urine cup to my probation/parole officer.



They will do the tests to determine if my urine is “clean.” Clean means that there are no signs of drug and alcohol use.



If my urine tests positive for any kind of illegal drugs or alcohol, this will be a probation/parole violation.



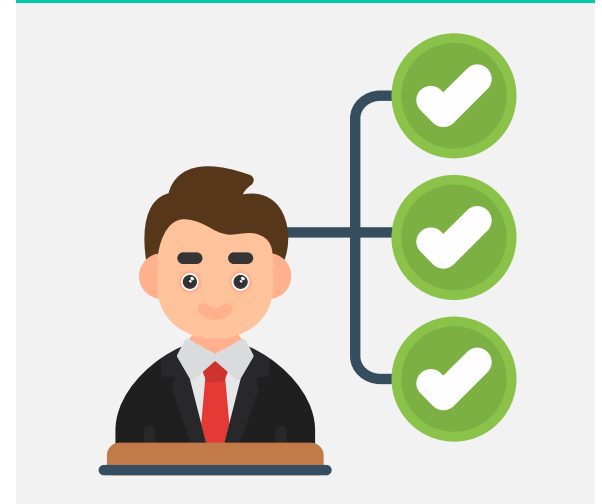
This could mean that I have my probation/parole revoked (removed)..



If this happens, I could go to prison/detention.



It is important that I follow all the rules of my probation/parole, including not using illegal drugs or alcohol.



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
