

When I arrive at the office, I will check in at the desk.

Someone will place small stickers on my head that do not hurt. They might be cold.














They will connect those stickers to wires.




The wires connect to a computer that will record my brain's activity. This is called an EEG.

It is important to stay as calm and still as possible.




The EEG can take 30 minutes to an hour or more to be done.






After that, the stickers will be gently removed, and I will be all done!
