

Consent is when I give permission to touch my body.



People should ask permission before they touch my body.



I give consent when I say "yes."



If someone wants to hold hands or kiss, I can say "yes" if I want to.



If I do not want someone to touch me, I can say "no." I do not give consent for them to touch me.



If I say "yes" but change my mind, I can say "no." That person should stop touching me.
