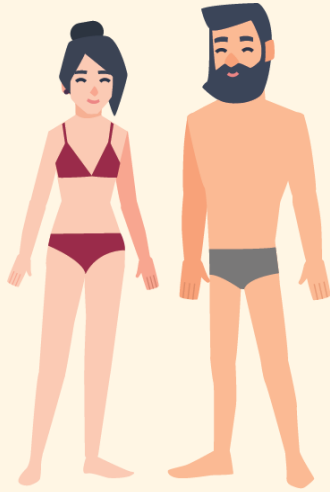
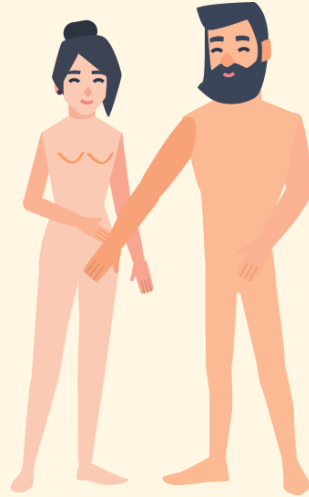


Sexual acts are private behaviors people do when they are alone or with romantic partners.



Looking at private parts without clothes and touching private parts are two types of sexual behaviors.



One sexual act is called masturbation. This is when a person looks at or touches their own private parts when alone in a private place.



Sex is another sexual act. It is when people put their private parts together.



Both people must give consent to have sex with each other.



Consent is when both people agree and feel comfortable having sex.
